Yangon General Hospital,
Myanmar

A new masterplan by Article 25 will guide the Yangon General Hospital into a future as the central institution of the Myanmar healthcare system. The implementation of Phase 1 is making buildings safe for patients and sets the stage for sustainable growth.



Education

Child Support Tanzania
Pre-School, Tanzania

The new inclusive pre-school in Mbeya, Tanzania will prepare disabled children for mainstream education in classrooms full of light and child-friendly outdoor spaces. It will be built with earth bricks dug from the site made by the local community.



Disaster Resilience

Boisrond Tonnerre School, Haiti

A new school and community hall are being built in Petionville, Haiti to replace the school destroyed in the 2010 earthquake. It is designed to be resilient and remains standing in another earthquake and hurricane, reducing fatalities and letting students get back to learning after a disaster.
